

GREENWICH TOWNSHIP  
MINUTES OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING  
NOVEMBER 18, 2025  
7:00 p.m.

Mayor Reinhart called the meeting to order stating “adequate notice of this meeting was provided in compliance with the Open Public Meeting Act notifying the South Jersey Times on January 5, 2025.”

Roll Call: Mayor Reinhart, Deputy Mayor Orr and Committeeman Werley were present. Also present were Thomas Seeley, Esq., Township Solicitor; Amy Colaneri, CFO; and Lisa Garrison, Township Clerk.

Flag Salute: Mayor Reinhart

Approval of Minutes: On motion of Mayor Reinhart, seconded by Deputy Mayor Orr to approve the minutes of July 14, 2025 and October 21, 2025, unanimously carried

Unfinished Business: None

New Business:

- Township Bank - Ms. Colaneri advised the Committee of tmahe problems she has been having with the Township’s current bank, Newfield National Bank. Mr. Seeley, Esq, Township Solicitor, indicated that he will contract the branch manager.

Reports:

Fire Chief – Chief Charles Reinhart indicated the company via a grant took delivery of a Kubota UTV. As the company desires to keep the current UTV they are in need of a larger trailer that will carry both UTVs. They are requesting the Township to pay half the cost of a new trailer, which is estimated to be \$13,000.00. Chief Reinhart indicated the other trailer will be sold with the funds to be given to the Township. On motion of Deputy Mayor Orr, seconded by Committeeman Werley to approve for the Township to pay half the cost of a new UTV trailer, in the amount of \$6,500.00, unanimously carried. Committeeman Werley questioned now that the Township is in a shared services agreement with the City of Bridgeton, for OEM services, how are they to be called out. Chief Reinhart indicated when the Fire Company is dispatched OEM is notified. OEM is generally dispatched for catastrophic events.

Committee Comments:

Mayor Reinhart indicated he had received a resident complaint.

Payment of Bills:

On motion of Mayor Reinhart, seconded by Deputy Mayor Orr to approve the bills for payment in the amount of \$187,644.67, unanimously carried.

Public Comment:

On motion of Mayor Reinhart, seconded by Deputy Mayor Orr to open public comment, unanimously carried. Kathy Barndt questioned if the Land Use Board had received a copy of the Cannabis Ordinance, as directed by Mr. Van Embden, Special Counsel. Ms. Barndt was advised that it had been forwarded to the Land Use Board and she could contact the Ms. Mangiafico to determine when it was discussed at their meeting. Ms. Barndt further questioned why Mr. Seeley had not recused himself due to his conflict from the table when the cannabis ordinance was introduced and the public hearing held. She advised that she had did have a problem with any of Mr. Seeley's comments during that time as it was a conflict of interest. Mr. Seeley indicated she could file an ethics complaint. He apologized if any of his comments had offended her but he felt there was no impropriety. Shawn Burke indicated he has been following the cannabis topic. He indicated that many other municipalities step outside of the normal methods of public notice for public input. He also indicated that the minutes and agendas are not posted timely as required. He stated he took offense with Mr. Seeley's tone with Ms. Barndt. He felt the people are not treated with respect at the meetings and should not be afraid to come to meetings. He called Mr. Seeley a "f\*\*\*ing \*\*\*hole". Mr. Seeley advised Mr. Burke to remove himself from the meeting to which Mr. Burke indicated he would not. At this time Mayor Reinhart called for adjournment. On motion of Mayor Reinhart, seconded by Deputy Mayor Orr to adjourn the meeting, unanimously carried.
